### **NAPLAN 2010 Invitation to all Year 7 & 9 parents**

Rose Bay Secondary College would like to invite parents of Year 7 and Year 9 students to attend a meeting on Tuesday 14<sup>th</sup> September between 6pm -7pm in the school Lecture Theatre to receive their child's NAPLAN results. As part of the National Assessment Program your son/daughter sat for 4 external tests in May. The purpose of these tests was to assess literacy and numeracy.

The results of these tests are reported to schools, students and parents using a common reporting scale with performance bands in reading, writing, language and numeracy. Rose Bay Secondary College will analyse these results in detail and identify areas of need for individual students or larger groups. These results will help inform teachers in their ongoing efforts to address the literacy and numeracy needs of their students. Looking forward to seeing you next Tuesday.

### STUDY SKILLS TIP FOR SEPTEMBER: WHAT ARE STUDY SKILLS?

Study skills are known by lots of different terms: effective learning skills, learning to learn skills, meta-cognitive skills, self-regulating skills, and independent learning skills. Whatever you like to call these skills, they are the generic skills that help students work more effectively at home, manage their assignments and study efficiently for tests and exams.

Some of these skills you will develop as part of your experiences in particular subjects. Other skills are more focused on the way you approach your work at home. But why are these skills important?

Well firstly getting higher marks will certainly give you more choices about what you might do when you leave school. There is also a strong sense of satisfaction in knowing that you did your best so you can walk away without regret.

However the importance of developing study skills goes way beyond these two reasons. The study skills you develop at school are actually lifelong learning skills. Regardless of whether you stay in the same career for your whole life or change careers 10 times, you will continually have to be learning. You will have to be certified, meet certain regulations, learn new elements of your job, study to move to the next promotional level – you are going to be learning for your entire life, it doesn't stop just because you leave school.

Through developing good study skills you are also developing personal management skills – how to make yourself do things when you don't want to do it, how to ask for help, how to manage and organise your resources – all sorts of things that will contribute to your future success. People with strong learning skills and self-management skills are more ready to face the challenges of succeeding in what can be a very competitive world. So each time you manage to get yourself doing something you didn't feel like doing, celebrate another success in the development of your personal strengths and abilities!

## Science

**Science Practical Teachers - Mr Nigel Kuan** from the Masters Program at Sydney University has been with us since Term 3 Week 1 doing his Masters of Teaching Internship. Mr Kuan teaches Year 12 Physics, Year 11 Chemistry, Year 10 and Year 8 Science. Mr Kuan will finish his practicum at the end of week 9. Mr Andrew Carman from the Diploma of Education Program at UNSW has been with us since Term 3 Week 6 undertaking his second practicum. Mr Carman teaches Year 11 Chemistry, Year 10, 8 and 7 Science. Both of these teachers have contributed to our faculty and we wish them all the best for the future.

**Year 7 Science** - Most Year 7 classes have been given or will be receiving an assessment task for their current topic 'Planet Earth'. This topic explores the layers of the atmosphere as well as the layers of earth. Students are required to construct a story titled 'Journey to the Centre of Earth' and include creative writing with scientific fact. Marks will be given for the story and the notes scaffold to be completed on the assignment sheet. There will be a topic test at the end of term. Term 4 will begin with the final topic 'Solids, Liquids and Gases'. Ms Bocaz's class homework booklets are due on week 8 Term 3.

**Year 8 Science** - Year 8 are currently working on "Body Systems". This topic will conclude in about week 3 of next term with a topic test. An assignment will be handed out next week and this will be due during week 2 of Term 4. Ms Bocaz's class will have a practical assessment on Week 9 about the "Human Body" and this will be on the kidneys.

**Year 9 Science** - Year 9 are currently working on "Energy Resources". They have an assignment due this week (Week 8) on the topic of "The Greenhouse Effect and global warming". A topic test on "Energy Resources" will take place on Week 2 of Term 4. During that time they'll start on the topic "The Dynamic Earth" which studies the earth's natural disasters and the science behind these disasters.

**Year 10 Science** - It is pleasing to report that there have been about 60 Year 10 students in attendance every afternoon for the past three weeks of the Year 10 Science revision. These revisions were held during weeks 5, 6 and 7. Unfortunately more than 100 students in Year 10 did not take the opportunity to revise their work before the School Certificate Trial which is now held on the first day back in Term 4.

Students are reminded that they must revise all Year 9 and Year 10 work for this Trial if they intend to do well in the exam.

Final rotation of Science classes will take place on Tuesday Week 10 Term 3.

### **Marine Studies**

**Year 9** - Students have been given an assignment for their topic "Fish Biology". This is due Tuesday, 21<sup>st</sup> September (Week 10). Ms Bingham

### **Year 11 – Physics, Biology and Chemistry**

Any Year 11 students interested in changing to or picking up "Senior Science" for Year 12 will have to pick up a note from Mr Pickering or the Science Faculty sometime next week to take home and get it signed. The Senior Science course is suitable for students who are interested in Science but who have found Physics, Chemistry or Biology difficult, or those who wish to pick up an extra 2 units of Science. See Ms Andre for more information.

**Chemistry - Yr 11** students are having their Yearly exam on Tuesday. Good luck guys and remember to read the questions carefully and thoroughly and only answer what the questions ask.

Students are reminded that their first assessment in Year 12 will be at the end of term 4, so students must not plan for an early holiday from school as these assessments contribute to the HSC mark in 2011.

**Physics** – Students are currently looking at "The Cosmic Engine". They have an assessment task on the "Cosmic Engine" due on Monday 13<sup>th</sup> September (week 9) and this is worth 15%. Students are encouraged to continue revising class work for their yearly examinations that will be held during weeks 9 -10 and seek help from teachers, with questions during their spare time.

### **Year 12 – Physics, Biology and Chemistry**

**Chemistry** - Students have finished all their assessments and they are to be congratulated for their perseverance and dedication shown. Students are reminded that there will be revision work in class time leading up to the graduation day. Ms Andre is also conducting a day of revision in the school holidays and all Chemistry students are welcome to attend. Students must follow a stringent revision program to improve their marks leading up to the HSC exam. All the best for the HSC examination!

**Physics** – Students are finishing the topic of "Quanta to Quarks". On Tuesday 14<sup>th</sup> September Mr O'Hare and Mr Kuan will be taking both Year 12 Physics classes to an excursion to the University of Sydney to the "HSC KickStart Physics Workshop" for the students to observe physics experiments from Quanta to Quarks using equipment only available at the university. Students are also encouraged to keep attending morning tutorial lessons, every Monday and Tuesday at 8am in room B406 to go over past exam papers and/or ask questions relating the subject. These lessons will continue until the end of the term.

**Biology** – Students have completed the course and will be practising questions and revising in class.

On completion of all course work and assessment tasks students will be revising the course and practising exam style questions to ensure they are thoroughly prepared for the HSC examinations. All students are expected to attend all classes until classes are dismissed in week 10.

As this would be the last newsletter parents of Year 12 are receiving regarding school work, we wish all Year 12 students and families of Year 12, "Good Luck" for the HSC and we know all the hard work you have put in will open doors for you in 2011. We have enjoyed having you at Rose Bay.

### LOTE

Year 7 French are currently studying 'About Self and Others'. The language assessment task for this term has been rescheduled for week 10. Students have received notification for a research assignment highlighting France's diversity of landscape and some of its most beautiful landmarks. This assignment is also due in week 10 of this term. Work booklets relating to this topic will be collected next week and marks will go toward Semester 2 reports.

Year 8 French/Year 8D Italian

All students are currently completing a unit entitled 'My Family'. The language assessment task is due week 9. Students will perform their radio interviews in class and each group will be required to submit their recording and script at the end of their presentation. Students have received notification for a research assignment on the regions of France and is due week 10 of this term. Work booklets relating to this topic will be collected next week and marks will go toward Semester 2 reports.

## Social Science

**Year 7 Geography:** There will a School Citizenship Program to address Environmental Awareness on Friday 24th September called "**Green Up. Clean Up**" for all of year 7.

**Year 8 Geography:** Will be presenting to the class their completed Assessment Task on Globalisation.

**Year 9 Geography:**

Examination (Skills Test) in week 10 (Mon-Tues) on key geography skills - Area Reference (AR), Grid Reference (GR), Latitude & Longitude, Bearings

Ms Russell's class: have successfully completed assignments on Communities and will be **revising skills** before starting Natural Hazards. Students are encouraged to **compile a Media File** on the **recent floods in Victoria** and to **find examples of extreme weather** being experienced by Australia at the moment. We will be studying synoptic charts and analysing Australia's weather patterns.

**Year 9 Commerce:** Examination (Test on Employment Relations) in Week 9 Friday 17th September

**Year 10 Geography:** All students are required to study the following Topics for their School Certificate (SC) Trial test: - Coastal Management

- Urban Growth and Decline
- Global / Regional Links
- Foreign Aid
- Future Challenges for Australia (ie: Population)
- Skills (including Research Action Plans = R.A.P)

**Year 10 Commerce:** Examination (Class Test on Savings and Investment) on Friday 17th September

**Year 11 Economics:** Students examination for **Economics** will be for **2 hours** (Section 1 = 20 multiple choice questions = 20 minutes; Section 2 = 4 short answer questions with parts a, b, c, d's = 40 minutes; Section 3 = essay on **'how and why governments intervene markets'** = 1 hour). The students must be **re-writing their essay P.E.E.L.'s** (as shown and taught in class) at least **10 times each** in order to be prepared to write the essay on the examination day. All students need to be using their issued **Practice Exam Paper Booklet** (issued with answers) to prepare for the other sections of the exam.

**Year 11 Legal Studies:** They need to be busy revising for exams, lots of essay and short answer practise being done in class. Students are encouraged to continue writing practice responses and forward them to Ms Russell for marking before the exam.

**Year 11 students:** Good luck for all your exams.

**Year 12 students:** All Social Science teachers are still completing course content and require students to attend ALL LESSONS till the end of term.

## **PDHPE**

All students from years 7 – 10 have been issued with a detailed scope and sequence that explains at length what students are doing each term in the theoretical and practical components of this course. Students have also been issued with a "PDHPE GENERAL INFORMATION FOR STUDENTS AT RBSC" sheet. This details the requirements in PDHPE in relation to uniform, theory lessons, homework, assignments and student conduct.

**Year 7** are completing a unit entitled "Am I Normal?" in the theoretical component of this course. In this unit students will look at factors that affect health such as adolescence and change, body image, eating disorders, the nature of mental health problems and seeking help/protective strategies. The assessment task for this unit is a speech/power point presentation for the selective class and creating a poster in glogster for the comprehensive classes. This task has been issued and student should be working diligently on this task at home. In the practical component of this course the students are enjoying participating in a variety of stick games such as softball/T-ball, cricket, hockey and Lacrosse. Students will be assessed on this with a skill assessment check list.

**Year 8** are completing a unit entitled "Life Long Habits" in the theoretical component of this course. In this unit students will explore risk taking behaviours, sexual health and strategies to minimise harm to lifestyle diseases. The assessment task for this unit is creating a pamphlet/newsletter or website. This has been issued in week two of this term and students should currently be working diligently on this task at home. In the practical component of this course the students have been taught the basic elements of an aerobics routine and a body combat routine. Most groups have now performed their routine and overall the students are to be commended for their outstanding performances.

**Year 9** are completing a unit entitled "Looking After Myself and Others" in the theoretical component of this course. In this unit students will look at supporting themselves and others, strengthening resiliency and developing equal and respectful relationships. The assessment task for this unit is creating a story book for the selective cohort and designing a comic script using

their lap tops. This was issued in week four of this term. Please note that Year 9 are working with edmodo on their laptops and should be checking this daily. In the practical component of this course the students are in the process of creating their own game. This was due in week six or seven and will be taught to the whole class, who will then play that game.

The **Year 9 PASS** class have now finished the unit titled Fundamentals of Movement Skill Development. This unit explored the nature of movement skills, the transfer of movement skills, practice and the value of mastering fundamental movement skills. To accompany this unit students participated in a range of sports and physical activities that involved breaking down a skill and into its fundamental and/or specialised movement components for the learning and coaching of various skills. Currently the students are completing the unit Participating with Safety. In this unit the students cover the topics; risk environments, risk behaviours, assessing risk, managing risk and injury management. The students will be issued with an assessment task this week. The written component will be due at the end of this term and the students will present their research findings via a "Prezi" presentation during the first lessons of term 4.

**Year 10** are completing a unit entitled "Composition and Performance" in the theoretical component of this course. In this unit students will explore influences on skill development and performance and applying mechanical principles to enhance performance. The assessment task for this unit is an end of year examination. Please note that Year 10 are working with edmodo on their laptops and should be checking this daily. In the practical component of this course the students have been taught the elements of dance composition and are now in the process of creating their own dance routine in groups of three or four. Most groups have now performed their routine and overall the students are to be commended for their outstanding performances.

**Year 11** should now be studying extremely diligently for their yearly examination. Part of this studying should include the completing and submitting to Ms Strong past papers. Students should also be accessing the board of studies website <http://www.boardofstudies.nsw.edu.au/> for sample questions and answers. Edmodo is used extensively in this class with all work posted, with assessment tasks and other helpful pieces of information. If a student is absent they must check this website and complete the set work that they missed. A reminder that examinations will be starting week 8 so students should be revising their work.

**Year 12** - This cohort has just finished analysing and reviewing their trial HSC results. Many students in the class are to be commended for their exceptional work ethic which has lead to some outstanding results. These students are now busily revising the course using a combination of peer tutoring, guest speakers and selective course revision. Year 12 should now be studying extremely diligently for their HSC examination. Part of this studying should include the completing and submitting to Mr Godby past papers. Students should also be accessing the board of studies website <http://www.boardofstudies.nsw.edu.au/> for sample questions and answers. It is essential that all students come to class ready for active revision for the remainder of this term. Students should also access the edmodo website daily.

Lastly, the PDHPE faculty would like to thank Ms Sqadrito and Ms Martin who have done a sensational job filling for Ms Davis and Mr Portada this term. Their dedication to the school and the students is much appreciated. Also, Ms Brittany Olsson from the University of Technology Sydney has been completing her final practicum with the PDHPE faculty this term. Ms Olsson has been with Mr Godby and his junior classes and has demonstrated that she will make an outstanding PDHPE teacher next year.

## **TAS**

Year 11 Design and Technology and Industrial Technology are in the process of designing their major projects. Their designs are to be completed by the end of week 9 this term. Students are to talk to their parents regarding the costs involved. They will then be able to start construction in term 4.



Practical subjects with fees must be paid as soon as possible. Parents who are finding it difficult to pay the fees, will have to send a note to the school explaining their position.

Ms. McDonald & Ms. Poniris's Year 7 Technology class have their 'muffin' Powerpoint due Friday 17th Sept. This will compliment their fantastic muffins that they designed and produced last week. Ms. McDonald & Ms. Poniris's Year 8 Technology class have a Powerpoint or Prezi on 'Eat your way around the world' also due on 17th Sept.

Mr. Braid, Mr. Hyde & M. O'Brien's Year 7 Technology classes are in the process of completing the acrylic projects together with their folios.

Mr. Braid - Year 8 students who are designing the acrylic clocks will need to bring in \$7 to cover the electronic mechanism. The electronic mechanisms are not part of the school fees.

### **Support Class**

This Thursday out students will travel on public bus to The Museum of Contemporary Art for the Bella Art program. The program is tailored to meet the unique requirements of our class, using the MCA's current exhibitions as a starting point and environment for activities and discussion. The stimulating practical workshop focuses on the processes of art making, comprehension and social skills, and are led by MCA Art Educators, a specialist team of artists and teachers. This is a free program and will be the second year that the support class have participated in the program. (There will be no work experience this week).

Week 10: Monday- IEP meetings for the 2011 year 7 students and parents coming into the support class. Also being held on Monday are interviews for the 2 Year 10 students who have applied to do the retail TVET course at Randwick Tafe in 2011. Interviews will be held in the meeting room at the school, and the class teacher will be present during the interviews.
