Consent forms were sent home with students via roll call in week 3 for the chicken pox vaccination – this is a one only vaccine. If you wish for your child to receive this vaccination please return the consent forms to the front office by this date.

# Mathematics

#### Year 7 Mathematics –

Year 7 examination will be held during week 6.

Comprehensive yearly exam:

\* it is a 1 period test to be done in class time during week 6

\* calculators are NOT allowed

\* the topics to be covered from semester 2 are: angles, further algebra, decimals, directed number and 2D shapes. The test will also cover brief content from semester 1

\* there are 35 short answer questions and 5 long answer questions

## Year 8 Mathematics

Yearly examination for year 8 is scheduled at November 8<sup>th</sup>

#### Year 9 Mathematics

Year 9 at November 3<sup>rd</sup>. Students have been given the details already and have to revise the topic contents thoroughly. They can use the on line packages – Mathletics and Maths Online -

offered. Students who have not yet subscribed can pay \$15 to the finance office and give the receipt to the class teacher for the password.

The certificates of Australian Maths Competition and ICAS Maths Competition have arrived. Congratulations to all the certificate winners.

#### SCIENCE

#### YR 7 Science

Students have just started their last topic of the year, "Solid, Liquid and Gases". They will be given an in class assessment task and a topic test for this topic.

Year 7 yearly exam is in week 6 and will include all of the content they have learnt this year and part of their current topic. A stringent study schedule will ensure success in this exam. Students will receive a notification of this exam closer to the exam date from their class teacher.

#### YR 8 Science

All students are currently working on their last topic of the year, "The Truth is Out There". They will be given an in class assessment task and a topic test for this topic. They should have submitted their Human Body assessment task and will sit their topic test for this topic in week 3.

Year 8 yearly exam is in week 5 and will include all of the content they have learnt this year and part of their current topic. A stringent study schedule will ensure success in this exam. Students will receive a notification of this exam closer to the exam date from their class teacher.

#### YR 9 Science

Students have started their last topic of the year, "Dynamic Earth". They will be given an in class assessment task and a topic test for this topic. Their Resources assessment task should have been submitted and they sat their topic test for this topic in week 2.

Year 9 yearly exam is in week 4 and will include all of the content they have learnt this year and part of their current topic. A stringent study schedule will ensure success in this exam. Students who have not yet received a notification of dates and outcomes must see their teachers in class time.

#### YR 9 Marine Studies

They're currently doing a topic on 'Fishing' and will be sitting their yearly exam at the end of week 4. A stringent study schedule will ensure success in this exam. Students who have not yet received a notification of dates and outcomes must see their teachers in class time.

#### Yr 10 Science

Currently students are finishing their last topic of the science rotation and all assessments will be completed by the end of week 4.

Students have completed their trial School Certificate and should be in the process of studying for the School Certificate, which begins Monday 8<sup>th</sup> November. Marked trial exams have been handed back and the marking scheme is available from the teacher or on Edmodo Year 10 Science account "nvwizs". We advise all students to meticulously go through their exam and revise any weaknesses.

#### YR 11 into 12 Science Students

The Science Department would like to welcome all students to the start of their HSC. Students will face many challenges during this year and may feel at times their whole life is riding open the next twelve month's outcome. However, remember that "giving your best" is the most important outcome and a valuable life skill. The challenges you will face will seem mere hurdles with a healthy and varied lifestyle, and a stringent study timetable. Setting a strong foundation now, will set the standard for the duration of the HSC.

**All students** studying HSC science courses are to ensure they have purchased their mandatory resources which will or may include DOT point, practical and exercise books. Please see your subject teacher for specifications. DOT point books can be purchased at the school for a cost of \$35.00, which is considerably cheaper than shop prices.

**Year 11/12 Biology** students have started their first HSC topic, maintaining a Balance, which focuses on the systems and mechanisms that maintain healthy cell function and the effects of environmental parameters on these. They have been handed their first assessment task, which is an open-ended investigation worth 20% of their final grade. This is due Friday week 4. All students are to purchase the Biology DOT point and exercise books.

**Year 11/12 Chemistry** students have started their first HSC topic, Production of Materials, which focuses on the search for new sources of traditional materials and new materials to produce valuable and useful products for society. They have been set mandatory homework and quiz every Monday. All students are to purchase the Chemistry DOT point and exercise books. Their first assessment task, which is worth 15% of their final grade, is due in week 9 and will be made available to the students in the next few weeks.

Year 11/12 Senior Science students have started their first HSC topic, Lifestyle Chemistry, which focuses on the application of science in the production, use and effects of consumer products such as, cosmetics, cleaning agents and pesticides. All students are to purchase Senior Science practical and exercise books.

**Year 11/12 Physics** students have started their first topic, Space, which focuses on space technology and the physic concepts behind it such as, gravitational force. Students are to purchase Physics DOT point and exercise books.

**YR 12 2010 -** Year 12 students are coming to the end of their HSC final examinations. THE END IS NEAR. Congratulations and we wish you all the best and happiness with your future endeavors. CIAO!!!

As the year draws to a close we are thinking about the students who will take on responsibility for the Vision and Values projects in 2011. #### Year 10

#### 1. Sport in Term 4

During term 4 students will begin completion of the Mandatory Senior Preparation Program. During Term 4 sport time students will be undertaking "teamwork challenge activities". Students are to meet at the Gym at the conclusion of lunch each Wednesday during Weeks 2- 5 of term 4. These activities form a part of the compulsory crossroads curriculum, which is a Board of Studies course that must be completed before students finish their HSC studies.

#### 2. Year 10 Mandatory Stage 6 Preparation Program

This Program will run full time during the weeks after the School Certificate Examinations, beginning in week 6 (15<sup>th</sup> November). This is a compulsory program for all students intending to enroll in senior study at RBSC. Some content of the preparation program must be satisfactorily completed in order for students to be eligible for the award of the Higher School Certificate. Eg 'HSC All MY Own Work" and "Crossroads". The course content includes the completion of the mandatory Cross Roads and "HSC all my own work" BOS programs; study and research skills; advanced learning skills using the net books; team building and challenge activities, the opportunity to hear from guest presents and attend an excursion to a Tertiary Education Institution.

Students travelling overseas after the School Certificate Examinations, must follow normal procedures when applying for leave, and bring a note to the school office requesting leave for this period of time. Students must also see Ms Metson in the A Block Staff room before leaving to arrange for the completion of alternative work. These tasks must be completed before these students can be enrolled in Preliminary HSC studies.

#### 3. Work Experience

At the conclusion of this formal program, Year 10 students are encouraged to participate in Work Experience, Volunteer Work or undertake employment. Students are encouraged to take the initiative and organise their own placement. Should students require assistance with this, they are to see Mr Bollard or Mr Manganaro. Parents are to write to the principal, Mr. Linton, outlining the employer and the nature of the work.

#### 4. Final Graduation

The Year 10 Graduation Ceremony will be held on Friday 10<sup>th</sup> December, and begins at **9:30am** sharp, running for approximately 1.5hours.

To ensure the smooth organisation of the graduation ceremony, students are to report to the assembly hall at 8.40am for a briefing practice, and to arrange seating. Students MUST be in full school uniform. including black shoes and white socks. Student's names will be marked off by their year Advisers and they will be asked to sit in their allocated seats.
