Dear Parents,

It is my great pleasure to inform you that the Rose Bay Secondary College community has successfully raised the necessary funds required to repair the oval. The 'Save the Oval' campaign has raised \$23,000 and is a major contributing factor in creating a safe and sustainable oval a reality for our students.

The funds have been raised through the following activities:

UNSW Band Festival Canteen	\$ 8,000
Whole school raffle	\$ 1,500
Trivia Night	\$13,500
TOTAL	\$23,000

The NSW government in 2010 contributed a \$20,000 grant to be spent on upgrading the oval. At the recent Trivia Night, the Honourable Gabrielle Upton announced that the NSW State Government would contribute a further \$45,000 to the upgrade of the College oval.

This means that the College now has \$88,000 available to spend on the oval. The P&C have been extremely supportive of this venture from the beginning and have kindly pledged to contribute the necessary extra funds that are needed to make the oval upgrade a reality. It is envisaged that the oval upgrade will commence in March 2012.

Thank you very much to all members of the Rose Bay Secondary College community; students, parents, businesses and staff; who have contributed to this cause. Special mention must be made of some individuals who, without their efforts, the oval upgrade would not have happened;

Science

Science summary

We hope all students found this year of science interesting and informative. The science department would like to make a big thankyou to all those students who tried their best in science this year. You have been a pleasure to teach and we look forward to teaching you next year.

Year 7

The Science department would like to congratulate all year 7 students for completing their first year of high school science. We hope they found it interesting, informative and most of all fun. We are looking forward to expanding their knowledge of science in year 8.

Year 8

Yr 8 is completing their final topic 'Space'. They can look forward to some very exciting practical lessons on space shuttle launches to wrap up the year.

Year 9

Year 9 students are completing the topic 'Natural Disasters'. To wrap up the year they will be engaged in a series of lessons focussed on building earthquake resistant structures.

Year 12

During the upcoming holidays year 12 students need to ensure all work is completed and content is understood. To achieve good results in the science courses students need to demonstrate deep knowledge and understanding of all course components. This understanding can only be achieved through diligence and sustained effort.

Biology

Biology students need to ensure they have completed all work to date. During the holidays students should revise and write notes on every syllabus point from the first topic 'Maintaining a Balance'.

Chemistry

Chemistry students have their first assessment task on nuclear chemistry due in week 10. Chemistry students also need to ensure they have completed all work to date. During the holidays students should revise and write notes on every syllabus point from the first topic 'Production of Materials'.

Physics

Physics students have their first assessment task due in week 10. Physics students also need to ensure they have completed all work to date. During the holidays students should revise and write notes on every syllabus point from the first topic HSC topic.

PDHPE

All students from years 7 – 10 have been issued with a detailed scope and sequence that explains at length what students are doing each term in the theoretical and practical components of this course. Students have also been issued with a "PDHPE GENERAL INFORMATION FOR STUDENTS AT RBSC" sheet. This details the requirements in PDHPE in relation to uniform, theory lessons, homework, assignments and student conduct.

Year 7

Year 7 are completing a unit entitled "Keeping Myself Safe" in the theoretical component of this course. In this unit students will look at personal safety and road safety as well as water and beach safety. Students will also be instructed in basic first aid and DRABC. This is linked with the Year Seven Life Saving program that is conducted at Bondi Beach in week 9 of this term – Monday 6th December through to and including Friday 10th December. In the practical component of this course the students have created and taught a line dance to their class. This

cohort did extremely well in this task and are to be commended for their efforts. This year group is now enjoying the challenges of learning how to juggle!

Year 8

Year 8 are completing a unit entitled "Smart Living" in the theoretical component of this course. In this unit students will explore risk taking and drug use, specifically cannabis and binge drinking. Students will also examine how to access health information and consumer protection/protective strategies. In the practical component of this course the students have designed a warm up game and taught it to the class. This task was also performed very well. This was worth 10% of their total course mark.

Year 9

Year 9 are completing a unit entitled "Don't worry ... be Happy!" in the theoretical component of this course. In this unit students will look at mental health, developing positive relationships, recognising and responding to abusive situations, discrimination and affirming diversity. Please note that Year 9 are working with edmodo on their laptops and should be checking this daily. In the practical component of this course the students are learning non-traditional team sports such as Tchoukball, European handball, Gaelic football and La Crosse. They will be issued with a skills assessment mark worth 10%.

Year 10

Year 10 participated in the Preparation program and within that program was the mandatory PDHPE Crossroads program. This year the students participated in a workshop conducted by Wheelchair Basketball Australia. This involved two presenters discussing with the year 10 students how they came to be in wheelchairs and the dangers of risk taking; especially for teenage boys. Students had the opportunity to play a game of wheelchair basketball which gave them an appreciation of the difficulties that people in wheelchairs face on a daily basis. The rest of the day was spent by year 10 watching a wonderful ABC documentary series entitled "Whatever! The Science of Teens". The three parts of this series that the students watched as a focal point for their discussions was risk taking, binge drinking and sex.

Year 11

Year 11 are currently completing their first option of Sports Medicine. Their first assessment for the HSC is due on Thursday 2nd December. It is imperative that all year 12 students attend every lesson, and that if a lesson is missed that they complete their work as soon as possible. Students should be spending at least half an hour a night on revising class notes and compiling a study summary. To assist these students with their studies they are in the process of being issued with a PDHPE Year 12 contract that stipulates what they need to do to perform well in this course.

Year 11 - Sport Lifestyle and Recreation

Students are completing their Coaching and Training Assessment Task. This is an online coaching course where they receive a certificate in 'Beginning Coaching General Principles'. It is recognised by the Australian Government and the Australian Sports Commission. In practical lessons, students are taking part in Basketball, Oz Tag and Soccer in preparation for coaching the year 7 students next term.

Year 7 Life Saving Week

Is on at Bondi Beach from Monday 5th December through to and including Friday 9th December. Any student that is not attending must come to school in week nine. A teacher is being employed to work with these students in the key learning areas during this week.

Social Science

Farewell:

Many thanks to Margaret Holdman who has been with us this year teaching Geography and Work Studies in the Social Science department. She will be missed by staff and students next year when she returns to JJ. Cahill Memorial High School.

Year 7 Geography

Students are studying Global Environments including Deserts, Polar Lands and Rainforests. Some classes have been watching David Attenborough's 'Frozen Planet' which has definitely enhanced their 'Polar Lands' learning experience.

Year 8 Geography

Students are studying Global Geographical issues including threatened habitats, tourism, urbanization, use of ocean resources, access to fresh water, climate change, energy use, human rights, indigenous people and self-determination.

Students from 8F & 8G Geography participated in a PHILANTHROPY CHALLENGE to raise money for NGOs and NPOs of their choosing. They were paid between \$0.10 - \$5 per home chore and raised **\$1103**.

The students have been busy deciding what to spend their earned money on: chickens, seeds, cows, donkeys, micro-loans for African communities, game rangers, adoption of an animal under the threat of extinction or to buy land in a rainforest.

Of particular success were the efforts of 3 particular students: Elizabeth Butterworth, Brandon Supatra and Jake Heron who went out of their way each week to do small 'teacher chores' around the school: carrying teacher books, tidying classrooms or washing teacher cars.

They truly grasped the initiative of philanthropy and all participants have been awarded "The Philanthropy Certificate" and small prizes by the CEO of the International Anti-Poaching Foundation (IAPF) Damien Mander (Australian ex-special forces Commando and Navy Clearance Diver) for their global 'civics and citizenship'.

Year 9

Geography

Students are studying Australia's communities including Surf Life Saving Clubs, sporting organisations and townships around Australia.

Commerce

Year 10 Geography

Year 11

Economics

Students from these classes have been working very diligently over this first term of the HSC course, writing paragraphs to their first assessment task in Week 10 over and over and undertaking weekly quizzes in preparation for their first assessment test. They have remained very focused, and sought much help from teachers when they needed it. A very impressive start to their HSC Economics course.

Geography

Students have homework due each Monday. They are studying Ecosystems at Risk looking at Coral Reefs in detail. Students have a field trip to Maroubra Beach on Thursday 15th December from recess onwards. Could you please remember to bring in your notes next week.
